Dogs and Livestock

Tangent is a rural city with agricultural activities mixed in with residential uses. It is important to note that Tangent does not have restrictions on animals. However, that does not mean that you can let your animals run at large or create other nuisance issues. We encourage you to try to solve the issue with the animal owner. If you have problems with an animal and are not able to get ahold of the owner, call Linn County Animal Control at 541-967-3806.

Dogs and livestock do not mix. If your dog does damage to livestock, you may be responsible for damages. Additionally, farmers have the ability to take care of dogs that run onto their property, which can include putting the dog down. Therefore, keep your dogs on leashes or in your yard. The farmers in the area do not take any joy in putting dogs down, but will if they are causing havoc on their land. (*See ORS 609.150*).

TANGENT RURAL FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT BOARD VACANCIES

As of July 1, 2017, there will be three open positions on the Board of Directors for our Fire District. The terms for Board Positions No. 3, No. 4, and No. 5 expire on June 30, 2017. Anyone who is a resident or property owner within the Tangent Fire District is eligible to run for these positions on the May 16, 2017, ballot. All positions are at-large and each is for a 4-year term (July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2021). Official filing for the positions must be done through the Elections Division of the Linn County Clerk's Office, Linn County Courthouse, 300 SW 4th Avenue, Albany, OR 97321. Filing deadline is: March 16, 5:00 p.m.!



Tangent is now a safer place to have a sudden cardiac arrest. PulsePoint is live in our community. The two PulsePoint apps have three main uses:

Notification of CPR needed in a public location - Users who have indicated they are trained in CPR and willing to assist others can now be notified if someone nearby is having a cardiac emergency. This notification allows citizen rescuers to respond and perform life saving measures before fire and EMS arrive on scene. Quicker response means the victim will have a much greater chance of survival.

Live call feed of local fire and EMS agencies - Have you ever wondered why that roof siren at the Tangent Fire station is going off? How about where that fire engine or ambulance is headed with it's lights and siren on? Well there's an app for that! Users who "Follow" Tangent Fire in PulsePoint can choose to be notified of incidents such as traffic collisions, structure fires, and other call types as they occur. This allows citizens to better understand what their local fire and EMS agencies are doing as well as what is happening around them.

Automated external defibrillator (AED) database - PulsePoint AED works in conjunction with PulsePoint Respond by allowing citizens to add public access defibrillators into the PulsePoint database. Those AED's are then verified by the local fire agency and will become "live", showing up for possible use in the event a cardiac arrest occurs near that location.
